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1.	Actions for Employers THIS MONTH: Registration for Foundation (pre-registration) Pharmacists Training – do not miss the recruitment deadline
	Pharmacist training is changing significantly to meet the new standards published by the GPhC – incorporating prescribing at the point of registration. Moving forward, you will not be able to provide foundation training without recruiting via the NHSE Oriel system.
	Training sites MUST be entered into Oriel/NRS between *January 11 2024 - March 1 2024* See more information here. You must agree to terms of participation, and that you will provide access to DPP and prescribing learning environment.

Please note at this point in time:

- •You do not need to identify who the DPP is and where the prescribing environment is
- If a multi-sector rotation is being included, you must identify where this rotational site is

All training sites wishing to provide training for Foundation Trainee Pharmacists (formerly Preregistration Trainee Pharmacists), including Community Pharmacy for NHS funding - 2025 starts, will need to be included on the **Oriel** platform

This comes into effect for the 2025/26 training year – but please note the **deadline for entering your programmes into Oriel is 1st March 2024**:

3.1. Launch of NHS Pharmacy First advanced service

The NHS Pharmacy First advanced service launched today, enabling community pharmacists to complete episodes of care for patients without the need for the patient to visit their general practice. The service builds on the previous Community

Pharmacist Consultation Service (CPCS) by enabling community pharmacies to manage patients for seven common conditions, following specific clinical pathways.

A national public communications campaign will launch from February, which will encourage the public to access advice and treatment from community pharmacy services for common conditions.

Community pharmacy teams can now prepare for Pharmacy First with NHS-funded training, to expand their clinical skills and improve patient care. Find out more on the HEE website: Community Pharmacy Training, and also see information below:

3.2. Community pharmacy teams – get ahead for Pharmacy First with NHS funded training

Explore a range of fully funded <u>training options for you and your workforce</u> This includes training for

• Community Pharmacy Clinical Skills

The new Pharmacy First service which includes providing advice and NHS-funded treatment, where appropriate, for seven common conditions, launched on 31st January 2024 as an Advanced Service. Self Assessment tools are available to support your preparation; check gaps, refresh or upskill training.

4. Designated Prescribing Practitioners (DPP)

We now have a dedicated information page with **Frequently Asked Questions** and lots of supporting resources: <u>Supervision for pharmacist independent prescriber training</u> provides information for pharmacists interested in becoming a prescriber, prescribers interested in becoming a DPP, employers or system leaders.

The page <u>Becoming a designated prescribing practitioner</u> provides useful information for independent prescribers who are considering becoming a Designated Prescribing Practitioner (DPP) to support a pharmacist through their prescribing course or have been approached by a pharmacist to act as their DPP. There are links to some information from the <u>Centre for Advancing Practice</u>, which has been adapted to be relevant for those supervising IP learners specifically.

A <u>DPP Routemap</u> has been devised locally with supporting information and links to key preparation resources, which are **freely accessible to all at any stage of your supervision learning journey**. Identifying learning and development needs in your prescribing practice helps to inform if you are best placed to supervise all, or specific aspects of a learner's practice, and identification of others who may support.

5. Pharmacy Supervision Consultation

A critical consultation for our workforce and profession was published in December 2023 *This consultation closes at 11:59pm on 29 February 2024*

The Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) is seeking views on proposals to modernise legislation governing the supervision of activities by a pharmacist in a pharmacy.

Consultation description

This consultation sets out proposals to amend the <u>Medicines Act 1968</u> and <u>The Human Medicines Regulations 2012</u>. The proposals are to:

- enable pharmacists to authorise pharmacy technicians to carry out, or supervise others carrying out, the preparation, assembly, dispensing, sale and supply of medicines
- enable pharmacists to authorise any member of the pharmacy team to hand out checked and bagged prescriptions in the absence of a pharmacist
- allow pharmacy technicians to take primary responsibility for the preparation, assembly and dispensing of medicinal products in hospital aseptic facilities

6.2. Pharmacy genomics workforce, education and training strategic framework

This <u>strategic framework</u>, released 22 January 2024, sets out a 3-year approach to integrate genomic medicine into pharmacy education, training and workforce development. It will empower the pharmacy workforce to use the increasingly available genomic tools to support medicines optimisation and deliver the benefits for patients.
